Administrator's Report by Randall Oliver

The City of Cheney would like to wish each of you a Happy New Year. We look forward to the possibilities of 2015 and would like to share with you the highlights of 2014.

Property- Dollar General donated 8 acres of farm land to the City. Lubbers Ford-Chevrolet purchased the land through a sealed bid process.

Bond Refunding- To take advantage of low interest rates, the City refunded three bonds. The refunding saved the City \$118,500 over the length of the bonds.

Bond Rating- The City applied and received a favorable bond rating of **AA-** from Standard and Poor's. This rating reflects the sound financial management of the City and the strength of our reserve funds. The City is very proud of this rating as it is well above average for cities in Kansas and throughout the country.

Pool- The maintenance department replaced the sidewalk, installed an ADA Ramp, and off street parking along 5th Avenue west of the swimming pool. Funds to complete the project were used from the Aluminum Can Recycling Fund. A mural was also completed on the west side of the pool by High School Art Students.

130th- Cheney celebrated its 130th birthday on May 31st at Souders Museum with a live band, games and food.

Water- Agreements were created between Cheney and Garden Plain to create an emergency water line interconnect This will connect the water systems together at 383rd St West and old Highway 54 intersection and allows us access to another water source in the event of an emergency. Construction will begin in 2015.

Annexation- 117 acres of land was annexed north of town. The land will be platted and a new commercial building will be built. Utilities will be extended to service the new business.

Sewer- Funds were secured from the State Revolving Loan Fund to reline 15,350 feet of our 1919 sewer mains. Construction will begin in 2015 and be complete by summer.

Emergency Plan- An Emergency Plan and Debris Policy were created for the City and personnel received disaster training to help prepare them for an event. Employees were also required to take a NIMS (National Incident Management System) course through FEMA.

Comprehensive Plan- Several meetings were held throughout 2014 to gain citizen input to update our current plan. The 2015-2025 Comprehensive Plan was approved.

Ball Diamond- The City purchased 25 acres of land to help expand the new high school ball diamond complex from a two-diamond to a 4-diamond complex. The two extra diamonds will be completed at a later date.
